Fingerprint Readers

As of March 17th, the fingerprint readers located at the Key West DJJ building's elevator and the gym are operational and will work to open the elevator door after hours and the gym door 24 hours a day. The card readers at these locations have been disconnected and no longer work.

If you haven't been fingerprinted yet, and need access to the DJJ building after hours or the gym facility, you need to take your swipe card and go to the Sheriff's Office Human Resources Division at the Headquarters building on Stock Island between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. to be fingerprinted. It only takes a few minutes.
