SmartCOP tip of the week

When a deputy completes a Subject Resistance (Use of Force) in the Offense module the supervisor must go into the Subject Resistance and verify that the report is completely filled out and the deputy marked the report finished. Then the supervisor must approve the Subject Resistance report.

The is not the same as approving the offense

report. Approving and Closing the offense report does not mean the Subject Resistance report is approved and closed.

Supervisors please go back onto your subject resistance reports in smart cop to make sure the reports are complete and closed/approved.

Death of retired officer

Albert "Butch" Albury, who retired from the Sheriff's Office in September of 2007, died on Saturday at his home in Key West.

Butch was first hired by the Sheriff's Office as a Corrections Officer in October of 1980. He became a patrol officer in 1983, transferring to the Traffic Enforcement Division in 1984. He continued to work traffic until October of 1999 when he transferred back to road patrol. In 2004, he went to work in the Division of Professional Standards as a Compliance Analyst and he remained in that position until his retirement in 2007.

His funeral will be held on Saturday, January 23rd at Saint Mary's Star of the Sea Church on Truman Avenue in Key West. A viewing will be held from 12 noon until 2 p.m. The funeral services will follow at 2 p.m., and after the funeral there will be a walking procession to the Key West Cemetery for the burial. After the cemetery services, a Remembrance of his life gathering will be held at the Renewal Center at Saint Mary's Church.

In lieu of flowers, Butch's wife Dorothy asks that donations be made to Saint Mary's Disaster Relief Fund for Haiti.
