### Art Behind Bars Events in MARCH

On Friday, March 2nd, 6-9 p.m., The Wave Gallery will host an exhibition of Art Behind Bars + Art After Bars, featuring the

work of inmates [local and national] who participate in the art-based community service project, as well as the work of former students. Over the years, Art Behind Bars has helped numerous people turn their lives around with the transformative power of art, while benefiting 330 non-profit organizations through the donation of artwork. Art-making while incarcerated helps to lower recidivism by as much as 32%. Everyone benefits when people don't return to jail; individuals, families, taxpayers, and the community.

This show will focus on new work created in Key West, or received from inmates all over the country, who want to do something positive for society. It also celebrates the success of those who use art as part of their personal recoveries. While incarcerated, inmates receive no compensation for their work; it is all community service. Former inmates share the proceeds of their work with the program. Thanks to the generosity of The Wave Gallery, all proceeds will benefit Art Behind Bars. The show will remain up through Friday, March 9th.

Then, on Friday, March 16th, 6-9 p.m., there will be a fundraising party in the beautiful garden of the White Street Deli-Café, 1019 White St., Key West. Become a member of Art Behind Bars and enjoy a fabulous buffet, open bar, entertainment, raffle, door prizes, and more. The raffle is for a 3-days+2-nights' stay at the Hilton Garden Inn in Miramar and a Discovery 1-day cruise to the Bahamas departing from Ft. Lauderdale. Tickets for the raffle are \$10 each; you need not be present to win. Admission to the party is \$50 per person.

## Important CJIS Updates:

Terminal Agency Coordinator (TAC) Michelle Rabinowitz and A/TAC Raye Liu attended the Region 5 Workgroup Meeting on February 15, 2006. There were some updates, changes, and reminders:

§ Per a new statute, **all law enforcement and corrections certified officers**, need to be re-fingerprinted electronically before January 1, 2008. According to Human Resources Executive Director Donna Moore all affected employees will need to go to the Key West Detention Center to the Identification Office in the Administration Section to have this done. The schedule for fingerprinting is as follows:

Monday - Friday

- 9:00 am - 11:00 am
- 1:00 pm - 3:00 pm
- 9:00 pm - 12 midnight

§ For the Jails: FDLE has provided an Agency Correction form for criminal history information. If action needs to be taken on a record that is incomplete or inaccurate, a request for corrective action shall be submitted to the FDLE Quality Control Section. The form can be found on CJNet at <http://www.flcjn.net/qcForm/qc.asp>.

§ NexTEST is available for all employees being certified or re-certified in FCIC. Should you need to take the CJIS class or a test, contact an Local Area Instructor (LAI) to proctor the exam. There are several LAI's in each Sector available, contact Michelle Rabinowitz or Raye Liu if you need assistance or information.

§ If you still have a copy of the FCIC User's Manual 2003, shred it. There is a newer version, "CJIS User's Manual 2005". The 2005 version is a little shorter than the 2003, but has different information. To print a copy of the CJIS User's Manual 2005, go to CJNet and click on the IDT Resource Center. At the right-hand side of the page, click on CJIS Manuals. Click on CJIS Certification Manual (July 2005) and print.
