With Christmas and New Years falling on a Tuesday this year, we would like to give all non-sworn, full time employees who normally get holidays off, the Monday before Christmas and the Monday before New Years off, in addition to the already scheduled Tuesday, December 25th, (Christmas) and Tuesday, January 1st (New Years) holidays. This will be noted on your time sheets as Admin. w/Pay. All non-sworn, full time employees who are required to work holidays, will get 16 hours credited to their Vacation bank effective the December 28, 2007 pay date.

All sworn employees who work shifts will have an additional 16 hours added to their Annual Leave (Vacation Time), with the approval from the FOP and Teamsters. This will become effective the December 28, 2007 pay date. This leave may be taken as follows:

With Supervisor's approval, Shift employees may use the extra 16 hours when wanted. (Time sheets are to be recorded as Vacation Time)

Part time hourly employees will be pro-rated.
