The Honorable Sheriffs of the State of Florida,

During the 2007 Legislative Session, the Florida Legislature passed Senate Bill 1920 which authorizes private property owners to prohibit or regulate activity on their property which opposes or supports ballot initiatives. We are therefore bringing this matter to your attention as your office may receive calls or requests for enforcement regarding the statute. The new statute, section 100.371(8), Florida Statutes, states:

No provision of this code shall be determined to prohibit a private person exercising lawful control over privately owned property, including property held open to the public for the purposes of a commercial enterprise, from excluding from such property persons seeking to engage in activity supporting or opposing initiative amendments.

As we approach the election season of 2008, the issue of political activities on private property may arise in your local community. Please note that this statute only addresses the exercise of political activity supporting or opposing initiative amendments. It does not address other forms of political activity.
