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### FUN-FILLED FEAST AWAITS ATTENDEES AT ORIGINAL MARATHON SEAFOOD FESTIVAL MARCH 15-16

**MARATHON, Florida Keys** -- Marathon is called the Heart of the Keys, but it's the tummy that will get the attention at the Original Marathon Seafood Festival. In its 37th year, the fun-filled feast is set for Saturday and Sunday, March 15-16, at Marathon Community Park, mile marker 49 oceanside.

The annual munch-a-thon features local delicacies like Florida lobster, stone crab claws, pink shrimp and smoked fish. Keys chefs are to offer conch in chowders, salad and fritters. Fresh oysters and clams, fried local fish and even hot dogs are to await hungry customers.

Sweet treats, including fresh Key lime pie, should provide a fine finish to the seafood extravaganza. Beer and soft drinks will be available as well.

Other attractions include a nautical flea market, boat show, arts and crafts booths and scheduled entertainers including the Key Lime Pie Band.

Festival hours are 10 a.m. to 9 p.m. Saturday and 11 a.m. to 6 p.m. Sunday.

Admission is \$8 per adult. Children under 12 are admitted free when accompanied by a paying adult.

### SCUBA-EQUIPPED EASTER BUNNY TO HOST EGG HUNT MARCH 23 IN KEY LARGO

**KEY LARGO, Florida Keys** -- Instead of bright flower gardens and green grass, the Easter egg hunt off Key Largo is to be staged near coral heads teaming with colorful tropical fish or a bed of sea grass in the Florida Keys National Marine Sanctuary. After all, when the Easter bunny is a scuba-diving gentle giant nearly seven feet tall (including ears), he can hide eggs anywhere he wants to -- as long as it's underwater.

Captain Spencer Slate of Atlantis Dive Center, mile marker 106.5 oceanside in Key Largo, is to host the annual Underwater Easter Egg Hunt in the warm, clear waters off Key Largo on Sunday, March 23.

The fundraiser for Kids In Special Situations, which provides gifts and holiday cheer to the area's needy children, is to launch from the Atlantis dock at 8:30 a.m.

Divers seeking underwater eggs are to check in at 8 a.m. at the Atlantis dive shop. There is no charge to participate in the hunt, and the dive charter fee is to be discounted to \$60 per person.

Once divers are aboard, the Atlantis boat will head out to a secret location on one of the Keys' pristine reefs. The scuba-equipped Easter bunny, bearing an uncanny resemblance to Captain Slate himself, is to submerge to hide his eggs, followed soon after by the egg-hunting divers.

All Easter egg hunters are to win prizes, with a dive trip for two awarded to the diver who finds a specially colored egg. Real eggs and non-toxic colorings are used to prevent any negative ecological impact.

#### KEY WEST ANTIQUES SHOW TO DRAW EXPERTS AND COLLECTORS FEB. 22-24

**KEY WEST, Florida Keys** -- More than 30 antique dealers from around the United States are to stage the country's southernmost antiques show Friday through Sunday, Feb. 22-24, on the historic island of Key West. The antiques are to be displayed against the backdrop of a Civil War-era fort that is now a museum showcasing the island city's intriguingly offbeat history.

The fourth annual Key West Antiques Show & Sale is to take place at Fort East Martello Museum and Gardens, 3501 S. Roosevelt Blvd., next to Key West International Airport.

Attendees can view and purchase a wide variety of antiques and collectibles during the event. Appraisals, antique clinics, snacks and a full bar are to round out the attractions.

To benefit the Key West Art & Historical Society, the antiques action begins with a preview and early buying party set for 6-9 p.m. Friday, Feb. 22. Attendees can sample hors d'oeuvres and libations while viewing and purchasing antiques before the show's public opening.

The show is to be open to the public 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Saturday and 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. Sunday.

Tickets to the preview and early buying party are \$25 per person and include admission to both days of the show itself. Tickets for the show only are \$6 per person. Tickets are available at the online museum store at [www.kwahs.org](http://www.kwahs.org) and at Fort East Martello.

#### KEY WEST'S OLD ISLAND DAYS ART FESTIVAL TO OFFER FINE ART AND WARM WELCOME

**KEY WEST, Florida Keys** -- In 1965, the Key West Art Center originated and sponsored a show of original fine art to promote the cultural image of the island city. Saturday and Sunday, Feb. 23-24, the 43rd annual Old Island Days Art Festival is to continue that tradition with works by approximately a hundred artists from throughout the United States and Canada.

Still presented by the Key West Art Center, the acclaimed open-air show is slated for 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. both days in the historic Old Town district. Whitehead Street is to be closed to vehicular traffic from Greene to Caroline streets, creating a lively outdoor marketplace where art lovers can view exhibitors' offerings while enjoying Key West's typically warm, sunny February weather.

Booths also are to be placed on Caroline Street within Truman Annex, a gracious enclave that includes the Harry S. Truman Little White House Museum where the late president spent 175 days during his 1945-1953 tenure in office.

Repeatedly lauded by "Sunshine Artist" magazine as one of the country's top 200 art shows, the festival is to feature artists in media such as watercolor, oil painting, sculpture and photography. The show is juried to ensure that its traditionally high standards of quality are maintained.

#### KEY WEST CRAFT SHOW TO OFFER CREATIVITY BY 100 ARTISANS

**KEY WEST, Florida Keys** -- The subtropical island that has nurtured creative spirits from John James Audubon to famed Cuban folk artist Mario Sanchez is to showcase the wares of approximately 100 national and regional artisans Saturday and Sunday, Jan. 26 and 27.

The Key West Craft Show, scheduled from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. both days, is to transform the island's historic lower Whitehead Street into a lively open-air marketplace. Now in its 23rd year, the event is presented by the Key West Art Center, a respected co-op organization for local artists.

Artisans' booths are to stand beneath Whitehead Street's canopy of tall shade trees, adjacent to attractions and museums including the Audubon House Museum and Tropical Gardens. Participants also are to offer their artistry just inside the Whitehead and Caroline street entrance to Truman Annex, named for the former U.S. president who spent numerous working vacations in the island city.

Show visitors can choose from stained glass, leather, jewelry, pottery, ceramics, woodcrafts and more. Traditionally, many items are inspired by or unique to Key West.

Artisan participants are selected according to a rigorous jury process, and all craft offerings must be original and handmade by the exhibitor. Show organizers' insistence on quality has earned the event widespread critical acclaim including a spot on "Sunshine Artist Magazine's" prestigious top 100 shows list.

Many exhibitors return year after year to display their artistry while enjoying Key West's typically balmy January weather.
