A message from the Department of Management Services, Florida Retirement System (FRS)

Dear FRS Member:

Given recent business and financial news, I'm sure you are wondering how this affects your retirement plan in the Florida Retirement System.

The vast majority of state employees are in the Florida Retirement System pension plan. This is known as a defined benefit plan because you know well in advance what your retirement benefit will be when you retire. The State Board of Administration (SBA) manages the investments in this plan. According to the SBA, "overwhelming majority of the assets managed by the SBA are conservatively invested for the long term in highly diversified portfolios." Financial gurus call it diversifying investments; others call it not putting all your eggs in one basket. That way if one of the baskets breaks, you do not lose all your eggs. In the case of the current news in the financial markets, SBA reports 1.76 percent of the plans are invested in the high profile companies Lehman Brothers, AIG, Washington Mutual, Merrill Lynch and Bank of America. Its professional investment staff and external investment managers work for you in a relationship of trust and confidence to manage your money properly during historical periods of financial stress. They recognize that such periods continue to occur due to the normal ebb and flow of global economic and financial forces.

The SBA adds an example; despite steep declines in global stock markets in 2001 and 2002 the conservative, diversified approach continues to keep the Florida Retirement System Pension Plan extremely healthy. As of July 1, 2008 the plan has more assets than is currently needed to pay future benefit payments by about 106 percent or \$6.9 billion. Under the SBA's stewardship, the Florida Retirement System is one of only a handful of public pension systems to maintain full funding.

Most importantly during these financial times, we want you to understand that under Florida law, accrued FRS Pension Plan benefits are guaranteed regardless of investment performance.

For those members who have chosen the investment plan, or defined contribution plan, make sure you are putting money away for your retirement by investing in a well-diversified portfolio. The state's defined contribution plan has a number of different investment options, all of which will respond immediately to the changes in the financial markets. We know these are important decisions to make as you manage your retirement money. Members should consult their personal financial advisers for guidance. Defined contribution plan members can call the My FRS Financial Guidance Line at (866) 446-9377 to talk with investment professionals.
