## Census Takers wanted

The US Census Bureau is currently looking for interested applicant wanting to participate in the collection of data for the 2010 Census.

### Job Description:

Serve as a temporary full time Census Taker (Enumerator) working in Monroe County for a federal government agency. It is anticipated the jobs will last 4 to 10 weeks. Primary duties include locating households, updating address lists, explaining the purpose of the census, conducting interviews with respondents, recording responses on paper forms or on a hand-held computer, and meeting with your Crew Leader every day to turn in completed work and payroll forms and to discuss your progress. Some field interviewing experience is desirable, but not necessary. They must pass a written 28 question test that takes appropriately 30 minutes.

Applicants must be able to use a computer, live in Monroe County, have transportation, a valid Florida driver's license and a telephone. They must speak, read and write English to communicate with household members being interviewed and to complete documents. Being bilingual, English/Spanish, is a plus. Employer is willing to train.
