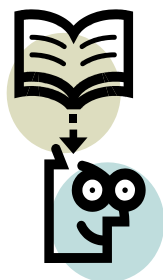

LVA Upper Keys Tutor Training Workshop

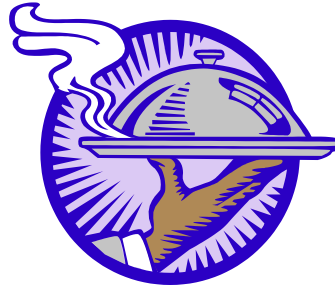

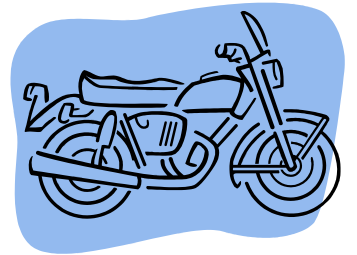
Culinary Class Dinner
